Policy and Procedures for Liquid Scavenger Operations

A. Authority.

Authority to regulate liquid scavenger operations is given under Section 19-5-104, 26A-1-108, 26A-1-114, Utah Code Unannotated, 1998

B. Purpose.

The purpose of this policy is to safeguard public health and to set standards for permit issuance, inspection, and permit revocation.

C. Incorporation by Reference.

The requirements as found in Utah Administrative Code Rule R317-550, Rules for Waste Disposal by Liquid Scavenger Operations are adopted and incorporated by reference.

D. Permits and Inspections.

- 1) No person shall conduct liquid scavenger operations in the TriCounty area without obtaining a permit from TriCounty Health Department. Only persons who comply with these regulations shall be entitled to receive and retain a liquid scavenger permit. Liquid scavenger permits are not transferable.
- 2) Issuance of permits will be made after:
 - a) A complete liquid scavenger application is submitted.
 - i. TriCounty Health Department must be informed of any changes to the list of operators, disposal sites, or collection vehicles provided on the liquid scavenger application.
 - b) Fees are collected according to the fee schedule adopted by the TriCounty Health Department Board of Health.

- c) The health authority has conducted inspections of all collection vehicles and equipment with the operators of said vehicles present and, if necessary, all disposal sites used.
- d) A list of all sites used for waste disposal and proof of permission to dispose of wastes at such sites are provided.

E. Permit Revocation and Penalties

- 1) TriCounty Health Department may revoke any permit for failure to comply with these regulations or in cases where the permit has been obtained through non-disclosure, misrepresentations, or misstatement of material fact.
- 2) The permit may be reissued upon proper application, fee payment, and presentation of evidence that the problems causing revocation have been corrected.
- 3) Any person who shall violate any provision of these rules and regulations or who shall refuse to comply with a lawful order or direction of the health authority is subject to penalties as provided by law pursuant to Section 26A-1-123, Utah Code.
